## The Outdoors for All Act

The Outdoors for All Act (S.448/H.R.1065) was introduced to codify the existing Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership (ORLP) program into federal law and provide access to safe, outdoor spaces for ALL people and communities.

Every person – no matter your ZIP code – should have access to quality green spaces. The Outdoors for All Act will guarantee that future generations have access to quality parks and green spaces and the social, physical and mental health benefits they provide.

Congress established the Outdoor Legacy Partnership (ORLP) program in 2014 to support the development of new outdoor recreation spaces. The ORLP program has successfully awarded over \$45 million in grants. 1 aiding 50 communities in the US.

Unfortunately, the ORLP program is not permanent. The Outdoors for All Act ensures that ORLP has reliable funding for years to come and makes the program more accessible by expanding which cities and towns are eligible for this funding. The Outdoors for All Act will allow more communities the opportunity to fund quality parks and recreational spaces in every community for future generations.
